

# **Growing Concerns**

- Water supply
- Food security and sovereignty
- Rising costs for insurance and infrastructure repairs / renewals
- Population loss to urban centres, reducing tax base
- Rising need to partner Indigenous and non-Indigenous communities without clear steps to do so

## **Rural Perspectives**

- Urban centers are often considered first when it comes to funding and available resources for climate adaptation, and there is little consideration for small and rural communities
- There is a lack of support from higher levels of government to address the unique needs of small and rural communities
- There is a lack of relevant resources, knowledge, and skills within smaller municipalities' administrative teams, and financial constraints do not allow for the hiring of consultants

# The Resilient Rurals Model

## Purpose and Benefits of the Model

A unique **model and toolkit** will guide small, rural, and Indigenous communities in establishing diverse **regional partnerships** to address growing concerns impacting their resilience.

Partnerships may include municipalities, Indigenous communities, non-profit organizations, education and research institutions, businesses, chambers of commerce, etc.

\* This model will be the first of its kind in Canada.


# Purpose and Benefits of the Model


Regional partnerships can enable:

- Collective advocacy


